

#### LENT - A TIME OF REFLECTION, RENEWAL AND ACTION

The time during Lent should be spent reflecting and reviewing our effectiveness as disciples in the cause of spreading the Good News. We should start with a positive attitude towards changing our ways, too often I hear the phrase 'well, we can't do that because...' . I'm sure if we put our minds and wills behind any project we would be able to change the way we do things, and some things that might have been classed as 'not-do-able' suddenly become achievable. I'm certain that we have many talented people with the South Leicestershire Group (SLG) and that we can find ways and means of generating new life into our church communities. Jesus came on an agenda of change, and we must adopt that same agenda if we are to grow the church, so that generations of new Christians can come and worship God. As I approach the end of my time with the SLG, I have had a chance to reflect upon the highs and lows, things that were achieved, and things that didn't work out, sometimes it doesn't do to analyse the past and decisions made at the time, because you are doing it in hindsight and with 20/20 vision. The challenge still remains for all of the churches 'How are we going to spread the Gospel News'? The challenge is clear, we need to be open to spread the Good News even if that means new people will come and take up the challenge, it might mean some standing down and handing on the responsibility to others. The challenge for each of us through this Lenten time is to seriously reflect upon our discipleship, on how we can live up to the Gospel imperative 'Go and make disciples'. This reflection should be done in prayer and reading the scriptures and then praying again then taking action. Our Eldership teams will be expected to take the lead, my hopes and prayers are that enough people will be moved to form project teams with the aim of reviving the church before we get to the point of no return, hopefully we can attract new folks to meet, to worship God and to keep our churches open so that more people can experience God's love in their lives.

#### RECIPE - March: Cherry Walnut Biscuits (Makes 20)

50g margarine

50g caster sugar

100g self raising flour

10g walnuts

25g glace cherries (chopped)

2 teaspoons desiccated coconut

4 teaspoons beaten egg

Pinch of salt

Preheat oven to Gas Mark 4, 350 F, 180 C.

- 1. Cream margarine and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 2. Sift the flour and salt and mix with the nuts and coconut.
- 3. Gradually add, together with the cherries, to the creamed mixture, and bind together with the egg.
- 4. Roll on a floured board and cut into shapes.
- 5. Place on greased or lined baking trays and bake for 15 20 minutes.
- 6. Cool on a wire rack.

#### GARDENING TIPS - MARCH

- 1) Sow annuals like nasturtium, poppies and marigold.
- Plant shallots, herbs and early potatoes.
- 3) Top dress your pots and containers with new compost.
- 4) Feed the birds they are busy nesting.
- 5) Complete routine pruning of established roses.
- 6) Fertilise perennial beds and apply a mulch of organic matter.

And as the sunshine filters through each separate window pane realise the time has come to Spring - clean once again.


So upside - down I'll turn each room, I'll scrub and polish too,

#### A recipe for Saucy Pudding contributed by Gill Gilbert.

#### Ingredients

2 oz margarine

6 oz caster sugar

2 eggs, separated

2 oz self raising flour

1 oz cocoa

1 teasp instant coffee, dissolved in a little hot water

½ pint milk

Cream margarine and sugar,

Add egg yokes.

Then add dry ingredients, then coffee and milk.

Whisk egg whites till stiff and fold into mixture.

Bake in slow oven for 40 - 45 mins, then moderate oven for 15 mins.

Keep an eye on it - don't let it overbake!

The amount of milk can be adjusted to make more, or less, sauce.
